

JUDr. PhDr. Marek Prudovič (born 1995) is a graduate of the Faculty of Law of the University of Trnava in Trnava (Bc. 2018, Mgr. 2020, JUDr. 2020) and the Faculty of Humanities of the University of Žilina in Žilina (Bc. 2018, Mgr. 2020, PhDr. 2021). During his studies, he received two awards from the rector of the University of Žilina in Žilina (2018, 2020), an award from the rector of the University of Trnava in Trnava (2018), as well as two awards from the dean of the Faculty of Law of the University of Trnava in Trnava (2018, 2020). He is currently an external PhD student after his dissertation examination at the Faculty of Law of the University of Trnava in Trnava in the study program Theory and History of the State and Law (since 2020). He gained practical experience as an associate (2020 – 2024), a mediator (since 2021) and an attorney (since 2024). In addition, he also gained pedagogical experience as a lecturer in the field of contemporary Slovak private law in the framework of several accredited lifelong education courses of the Ministry of Education, Science, Research and Sports of the Slovak Republic, as well as the mandatory education of mediators announced by the Ministry of Justice of the Slovak Republic (since 2022).
