The continuing assessment represents 50 % of the final grade while the remaining 50 % consists of an essay written by the student on a previously agreed topic related to human rights. Evaluation: A: 100%-91%; B: 90%-81%; C: 80%-71%; D: 70%-66%; E: 65%-60%; FX: 59%-0. <b>Finished:</b> By exam.					
<b>Learning outcomes:</b> Upon successful completion of the course, students will acquire knowledge of the protection of human rights under the core international human rights treaties. Students will be aware of the guaranteed level of protection of human rights, particularly across the European continent, will be able to use relevant case law, in particular that of the European Court of Human Rights, and will be able to identify the interrelationships between the various core international human rights instruments.
